

##### **Botanic Gardens**

#### ALICE SPRINGS ACTIVITIES

##### **School of the Air**

"The World's Largest Classroom" covering more than 1.3 million square kilometres and it reveals stories about the school and its students' outback lifestyle and the world-renowned innovations of this uniquely Australian school

##### **Alice Springs Telegraph Station Historical Reserve**

A stone's throw from the School of the Air, the Alice Springs Telegraph Station is a historic museum precinct with indoor and outdoor displays, presenting the story of the connection of Australia to the rest of the world through Telegraph Communication in 1871.

##### **Yubu Napa Art Gallery**

It's a space featuring some of the top artists from Central Australia and the Top End - a short stroll from Todd Street Mall. It proudly has an artist studio onsite. You can experience the rare privilege of meeting some of the artists who create these beautiful pieces. The Precinct creates a unique cultural experience and a great chance for locals and visitors to Alice Springs to better understand the art and the stories being painted. The studio showcases some of the most original and contemporary indigenous artworks available.

# SELF GUIDED OPTIONS



## Araleun Arts Centre

The Araluen Art Collection is one of the most important collections in the country, in particular its collection of Aboriginal artworks tracing the history of Aboriginal art development in Central Australia and the beginning of the Western Desert art movement, including original artworks by renowned watercolourist Albert Namatjira and Papunya boards from the early 1970s. (Open daily 10-4pm).

## Alice Springs Desert Park

The Desert Park is where you touch, taste and start to know the outback's biggest secret *"the outback is a treasure trove of unexpected stories, colour and most of all life."* It will change everything you know or thought you knew about the outback. Part adventure safari park and part hands on natural history museum. You'll come face to face with emus, kangaroos, birds of prey and the biggest nocturnal house in the Southern Hemisphere. You'll need about 3 hours to explore (open from 7.30am to 6pm).

## Mountain Biking

Alice Springs is a mountain biker's paradise. A town where the weather is perfect, the trails are stone's throw away and the landscape is staggeringly beautiful, with a wide range of trails for all skill levels in and around the city centre. ## ULURU ACTIVITIES

### Harley Davidson Tour

Are you a Thrill Seeker, do you want to try something different? Imagine seeing Uluru from the back of a late model Harley Davidson - an unforgettable experience.

### Hire a Bike

Cycle around the rock, approximately 15 kms and 3 hours to complete, get up close and personal on your cycle adventure.

### Dot painting workshops

Maruku Arts Dot Painting Workshop provides a fun introduction to local Indigenous Art. Anangu paintings are created for educational and ceremonial purposes as well as telling of events. Join local Indigenous artists and learn about the different symbols depicting Creation Time (Tjukurpa) stories.

### Free Activities

Join a bush yarn at the Circle of Sand with a local Aboriginal storyteller and learn about weapons or bush tucker. Pay a visit to Wintjiri Arts + Museum showcasing local Anangu products, watch artists at work and learn more about the regions history, geology, flora and fauna in the museum's display. Or browse the many art pieces at the Resort's art galleries and at the Cultural Centre in the National Park and support local Mutitjulu artists. These activities are operated daily and don't require a booking, just show up on the day.
